Students get filmmaking direction from pros

"Lights, camera, action" three words that the 14 high school students participating in the Summer Production Mentorship Program will hear over and over again this week.

The teens, juniors or seniors at

the Chicago Vocational Career Academy, are spending four hours a day in production for the short film "Scream at Me." Filming is taking place near the school, which is at 2100 E. 87th St.

The mentorship, in partnership with Chicago Public Schools' Education to Careers program, is a sixweek paid workshop formed to increase diversity and minority interest in the film industry.

The workshop, designed by the national nonprofit organization Independent Feature Project, allows filmmakers and industry professionals to work with selected students in creating and producing a short film.

Due to the "sophistication" of

the script, what was supposed to be a five-minute short now is 15 minutes long. "There's something different about this script," says John Mossman, the film's Independent Feature Project producer. "It has a great amount of depth."

Derrek Jones, 17, wrote the screenplay as part of academy's ra-dio/TV majors class. The script, chosen from among several sub-missions, has undergone pre-production and now is ready to be filmed

The students are working closely with Mossman and Project assistant producer Hannah Roth from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. this week, earning \$6 an hour. Set for release in three weeks, the film focuses on an inner-city teenager torn be-tween remaining with his often discouraging friends or following a brighter path.

The program introduces students to the varied careers available in the highly competitive film industry. Each of the program's participants have been given a specific task to carry out during production. Mossman says many of the students - the group includes several hired to follow the making of the film for an upcoming documentary — often prefer to stay late to finish assignments. "With [14] students, the chal-

lenge is making sure everyone is learning and that everyone is having a great experience," says
Project Executive Director Elizabeth Donius. "The kids have to
choose to do this. They get paid
\$6 an hour, but it's still their sum-

by the team also have worked closely with the crew.

Last year, the program was held at Curie High school. The script was not written by the students and shooting lasted only two days. Now in its second year, the Summer Production Mentorship Program has been increased to five days, Donius says, adding that her organization is looking forward to expanding the workshop to more Chicago high schools.

After post-production, each student will receive a DVD version of the film that also will include the documentary. The filmmakers plan to enter several film festivals and offer a "Scream at Me" summer premiere screening on Aug. 19. For now, though, the group is focusing on finishing the film.

"Whether it will be good or bad or brilliant is up to them," says Mossman. "Everybody has a voice, and this is theirs."
